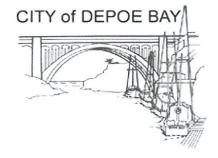

City of Depoe Bay 2024-25 Budget Budget Message

To the City of Depoe Bay Budget Committee and the Depoe Bay Community,

Staff is pleased to submit the Proposed Budget for the 2024-25 fiscal year for your consideration and subsequent approval. This budget message is intended to provide a high-level overview of the proposed budget document by highlighting important financial impacts for the upcoming fiscal year. This proposed budget focuses on maintaining fiscal responsibility and reflects the City's commitment to meeting the needs of our community while maintaining financial stability.

The budget document is the single most important policy document of the City. It sets expectations and establishes operational and financial plans for the delivery of City services. It provides revenue and expenditure information for the City overall as well as by funds and gives residents a better understanding of the City's operations and fiscal programs as well as provides transparency in government spending. The budget has been prepared in accordance with Oregon Local Budget Law.

The proposed budget provides appropriations, revenues, and transfer projections by fund. The budget pages typically include (from left to right) actual audited figures for the two most recent fiscal years; however, in this proposed budget the two most recent fiscal years have not been audited and only adopted numbers are reflected on this budget submission. The current year's budget information is represented, and the proposed amounts for 2024-25. The last three pages of the budget document are supplemental, providing total line-item amounts and their breakout to funds for the following expenditure categories: Personal Services, Materials & Services, Transfer.

REVENUES

Based on our current year revenues, it appears that the overall total revenue is not increasing as it has in recent years past. The overall net change in total revenues from the current year budgeted amount to the proposed budget amount is approximately \$1.7 million (less than a 2% increase). This is predominately due to a decrease in the Transient Room Tax (TRT) and Intergovernmental revenues.

All Franchise Agreements and Leases are current amounts and are based on current rates. State Revenue Sharing, Cigarette, and Liquor taxes are proposed revenues and are based on per capita estimates provided by the League of Oregon Cities (LOC). The population used is 1,559. Until recently, the City was penalized 10% on these funds due to noncompliance with audit requirements for fiscal years. Since the legislature removed the penalty, the City received a return of those held back funds. Estimates with the FY 24/25 budget reflect the removal of that penalty. Marijuana Tax funds have been included in the General Fund. These funds are managed and collected by the state. They have been shown in the fund as dedicated funds.

<u>Transient Room Tax, \$1,800,000.</u> The imposition of the TRT is set forth in the City of Depoe Bay Charter. TRT funds support marketing, public safety, street maintenance, parks and

recreation, parks capital fund, and City facility maintenance. Although TRT growth in FY 21/22 was very strong, there is a leveling out, and estimated year-end TRT revenues are lower than budgeted for. The proposed budget is \$200,000 lower than in FY2023-24.

<u>Franchise Fees, \$200,500.</u> Depoe Bay charges a franchise fee to utility companies for using City owned right-of-way. NW Natural Gas, Central Lincoln PUD, CenturyTel, North Lincoln Sanitary, Spectrum/Charter Cable, Lightspeed Network and Coastcom Inc. pay franchise fees. A low estimate is in the budget for Spectrum/Charter as it is unknown as to how many residents will switch to them.

<u>Licenses and Permits, \$50,100.</u> Depoe Bay charges permitting fees for planning activities including building permits, plan reviews, geotechnical reviews, zoning appeals and system development charges. FY2023-24 revenues are tracking higher above budgeted amounts due to the increasing activity in The Hills of Depoe Bay and Whale Watch developments.

Intergovernmental Revenue, \$1,953,770. Intergovernmental revenues are monies obtained from other governments, including grants, shared taxes, liquor revenue allocation, state revenue sharing, state highway tax apportionment, and marijuana tax allocation.

<u>Charges for Services, \$40,250.</u> Charges for services lease revenue and community center and recreation fees.

<u>Miscellaneous</u>, \$8,150. Miscellaneous revenues contain some lease revenues, interest earnings, miscellaneous sewer charges, report fees, and other assorted small fees.

<u>Iransfers-In, \$2,955,262.</u> The City of Depoe Bay budget is made up of funds which are self-balancing sets of accounts that are separated according to law, regulations and/or City purposes. Funds received in one fund can be used for expenditures in another fund if they are properly transferred and comply with revenue restrictions.

<u>Proprietary Funds</u>: Pursuant to Resolution 377 (Oct 2007), moorage fees are to be increased annually based upon US City Average CPI-UC, with the increase restricted to not less than 3% nor more than 5%, the increase for 2021-22 will be 3% per the resolution and CPI report. Pursuant to Resolution 513-21, water and sewer charges increase annually, as of July 1, 6% for water and 13% for sewer. System Development Charges (SDC's) reflect annual adjustments based upon the Construction Cost Index from the prior-year inflation rate. SDCs are expected to increase as The Hills of Depoe Bay and Whale Watch build out.

Grant funding included in the proposed budget:

<u>General Fund:</u> The City anticipates a grant for an update to the Parks Master Plan. Annually, the City applies for an is usually granted a small grant award from the Lincoln County Emergency Management department through the Lincoln County Board of County Commissioners.

<u>Harbor Fund:</u> State Marine Board Maintenance Assistance Program (MAP) has awarded a grant for the replacement of the Pumpout station and additional ability to do maintenance on the fish cleaning station and public bathrooms on the southside of the harbor. In addition, as a final piece to being able to finish the Docks 2-4 Replacement Project, the City will receive 1.5 million in funds through a legislative award.

<u>Street Fund</u>: ODOT's Small City Allocation. The City was awarded a Small Cities Allotment (SCA) grant for the Bay Street Sidewalk improvement project.

EXPENDITURES

As we are required to have a balanced budget, our total expenditures cannot exceed our total revenue. Personnel Services expenditures are increasing due to an increase in the number of staff and COLAs. Benefits have only gone up slightly from last year. Material and Services expenditures are increasing due to increased operational material and supply costs and contracted service costs.

Personnel services have been summarized into three lines (salaries, benefits, and overtime) to simplify the presentation. A schedule of personnel services paid from different funds is presented in the back of this document to illustrate the cost sharing across funds for budgeted positions. However, to further simplify accounting and payroll, personnel are recorded and paid out of the General Fund with transfers from other Funds to "pay back" the payroll.

<u>Personnel Services, \$1,617,752.</u> Personnel expenditures include salaries for full and part-time employees, overtime pay, on-call pay, FICA, Medicare taxes, workers compensation, unemployment reimbursement, medical and dental insurance, life insurance, long-term disability insurance and retirement. Medical Insurance rates are increasing approximately 9% effective 01/01/25. PERS rates do not change in FY 2024/25. COLA is proposed at 3.1% per CPI.

<u>Materials and Services, 2,917,713.</u> Materials and services account for the operational or maintenance costs for each department. Materials and services include contracted services, supplies, chemicals for the treatment plants, asphalt, pipe, etc. Equipment purchased in materials and services is distinguished from capital equipment in that it has a smaller dollar value (<\$5,000) and/or a shorter shelf life.

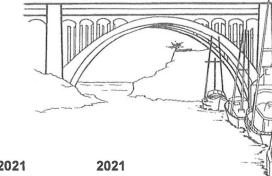
<u>Capital Outlay, \$6,940,625.</u> Capital purchases are long-term assets that are purchased by all funds. Capital purchases are assets that are used over a me period greater than a year, and cost more than \$5,000. Examples of capital purchases include buildings, vehicles, roads, pump stations, sidewalks, etc. This category does NOT include reserves that are in Capital funds.



<u>Debt Service</u>, \$395,000. Debt service is contained in the water and sewer funds. Water rates pay for water equipment financing debt, and property taxes pay for the sewer bond fund debt.

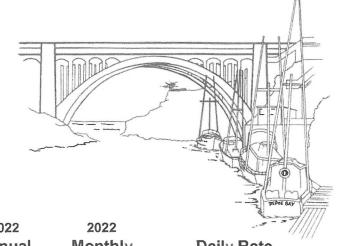

Budget Message Fiscal Year 2023 – 2024 City of Depoe Bay

Staff is pleased to submit the proposed budget for FY 2023-2024 for your consideration.

The budget for the City of Depoe Bay was prepared in accordance with current municipal budget law (ORS Chapter 294). The City's financial statements are prepared on an accrual basis of accounting, in compliance with revised rules of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB). The City maintains and prepares fixed assets inventories for audit pursuant to GASB Rule 34, as modified for small cities. While local budget law allows for biennial budget periods the City continues to budget on an annual fiscal year budget period.

The proposed budget includes the following major and non-major governmental funds: the General, Transient Room Tax, Street, Parks & Buildings, Emergency Services (new for FY 23/24) and Salmon Enhancement Funds; and proprietary funds: the Harbor, Sewer, Sewer Debt Service, Water, Miroco Water Reserve and Water Debt Service Funds.

The proposed budget provides appropriation, revenue and transfer projections by fund. The budget pages include (from left to right) actual figures for the two most recent fiscal years, current year budget information, and the proposed amounts for 2023-24.

As we move to a post-pandemic new normal, much like businesses and communities throughout Oregon and across the United States, the City of Depoe Bay is experiencing many challenges including inflation, the cost of operations outpacing revenue, a housing and unhoused crisis, a need for ongoing funding to provide services after one-time state and federal funds expire, and the challenges of funding a desperately needed harbor restoration project.

The economic challenges are combined with a severe shortage of employees to fill open positions throughout the country, and while not felt in Depoe Bay at this time, with some employees nearing retirement, succession planning has begun.

Inflation rates have increased and supply chain issues continue to impact the ability to buy certain goods and products such as pipe and other items to maintain City infrastructure.

Governmental Accounting

City government accounting utilizes various funds for budgetary and accounting purposes. The General Fund houses the City's general operations, including City administration, land use and planning, parks and recreation, emergency services, and Salmon Enhancement. The Transient Room Tax Fund can be used only for tourism promotion and facilities, as well as prorated use of facilities by tourists. The Street Fund receives direct revenues from state and local gas taxes that must be used for street and non-motorized activities. Likewise, the Water Fund and Wastewater Fund use revenues from customer rates to fund just those operations. Any revenues collected from designated sources may not be used for general purposes. The budget also includes the operating and debt funds for the Urban Renewal District.

should legislative funds not be received. Other proposed transfers include: transfer from the Transient Room Tax Fund to General Fund to fund General Fund activities.

The budget meeting(s) will provide a forum for discussion of the budget and for development of fiscal policies and program directions as needed. Matters other than those mentioned above will be discussed as the budget meeting progresses.
